Sussan Corson is a Director in the U.S. Public Finance Department and Team Lead for Pension and OPEB at S&P Global Ratings. In her role, Sussan leads an analytical team focused on criteria development and thought leadership related to pension and other post-employment benefit liabilities as well as the underlying funding assumptions that inform credit risk. Sussan also covers state government credit and is currently the lead analyst for Florida and Maryland.

Since joining S&P in 2002, she has covered higher education, water-sewer utility, short-term, municipal pools and general obligation credit ratings in the western and southern United States and was the sector lead for the tax increment and special district sectors. Sussan joined the U.S. State Government group in 2013.
